For each paragraph, tell Ss to read the first and the last sentences of the paragraph, which can possibly help them get the main idea. After that, Ss look through the headings again and match the paragraph with the heading containing most relevant/ suitable information.</li> <li>- Put Ss into pairs to do the activity.</li> <li>- Check answers as a class. Make sure Ss understand the questions.</li> <li>- Ask Ss to underline the key words in each question.</li> <li>- Then have Ss read the text. For each question, tell Ss to locate the key words as well as the paraphrases of these key words in the text and decide the best option for each question.</li> <li>- Have Ss work in pairs to compare their answers.</li> <li>- Check the answers as a class and ask Ss to explain their choice.</li> </ul> <p>For question 1, the article mainly discusses the benefits of AI in mass media.</p> <p>For question 2, in paragraph 1, the article does not tell readers that AI can help journalists express their opinions.</p> <p>For question 3, "face recognition" is mentioned as a typical example of how AI can make social platforms safer for the users. It is used as a way of supporting the main idea.</p> <p>For question 4, in paragraph 3, the last sentence indicates that a number of channels or programmes will be recommended for the users. | <b>Write an essay (180–200 words) about the benefits of using ai in creating content for the mass media and the problems caused by it. Select and combine information from Reading and the suggested ideas below. (20 mins)</b>  |  |   |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Have Ss read through the problems of using AI in creating contents on the mass media and reasons.</li><li>- Ask Ss to make a list of the benefits and possible problems of using AI in creating content on the mass media. Tell Ss to select and combine the information from the text in Reading and from the table in Writing.</li><li>- Have Ss work in pairs. Ask them to discuss the organization of the text.</li><li>- Give Ss enough time to write an essay (150-180 words) about the benefits and possible problems of using AI in creating content on the mass media. Set a time limit depending on the Ss’ ability level.</li><li>- Walk around the class and offer help if necessary.</li><li>- If time allows, ask Ss to swap their essays with a partner for peer review. Encourage them to make revisions based on peer feedback and then proofread it carefully for any mechanical mistakes such as spelling, punctuation, and capitalisation.</li><li>- Collect Ss’ essays to mark and provide written feedback in the next lesson.</li><li>- In weaker classes, provide Ss with the outline below.</li></ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Students work in individually to find the suitable heading for each paragraph.</li><li>- Students compare their answers.</li></ul> | <p><i>Suggested answers</i><br/>1-E ; 2- B; 3-D</p> |

- Students can thoroughly understand the content of the text and complete the tasks successfully.

| <b>Task 1: Listen and read. (6 mins)</b>   |  |   |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Put Ss into groups. Draw a mind map on the board and write Endangered Species in the middle. Have groups brainstorm as many aspects of the topic as possible, e.g. kinds of species, where they are found,.... Give Ss a time limit for the brainstorming.</li> <li>- Ask some groups to call out their ideas and write them into the mind map on the board. Praise groups for good effort.</li> <li>- Have Ss look at the picture and elicit the context of the conversation by asking some questions, e.g. What animals do you see in the pictures? Where is Mark?</li> <li>- Play the recording twice for Ss to listen and read along. Have Ss underline words and phrases related to the world of work while they are listening and reading.</li> <li>- Put Ss in pairs and ask them to compare the words and phrases they have underlined and discuss their meaning. Then check comprehension as a class.</li> <li>- Call on three Ss to read the conversation aloud.</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Students give as many species as possible</li> <li>- Students listen to the recording.</li> <li>- Students underline words/phrases related to wildlife conservation.</li> <li>- Students compare the words and phrases with their partners.</li> <li>- Students read the conversation aloud.</li> </ul> |   |
| <b>Task 2: Read the conversation again and decide whether the statements are true or false. (5 mins)</b>   |  |   |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Put Ss in pairs. Ask them to read the statements carefully and decide whether the statements are true or false. In stronger classes, encourage Ss to do the task without looking back at the conversation.</li> <li>- Then have them read the conversation again and locate the part of the conversation that has the information for each of the questions.</li> <li>- Have Ss share their answers with the class.</li> <li>- Confirm the correct answers.</li> </ul>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Students work independently to do the activity.</li> <li>- Students compare the answers in pairs.</li> </ul>  | <p><b>Key:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Have Ss read each sentence and try to think of the missing information to complete the sentences.</li> <li>- In weaker classes, encourage Ss to read the conversation again and find the sentences.</li> <li>- Check answers by calling on individual Ss to read the complete sentences.</li> <li>- Remind Ss of types of clauses learned in the unit (adverbial clauses of condition and comparison).
