One major benefit of online classes is convenience. All materials, discussion questions, and tests are stored on online platforms, allowing students to access them anytime and anywhere. In addition, lectures can be delivered live to many students at the same time and can also be recorded so learners can watch them again later.

Despite these benefits, online learning also has several drawbacks. According to Dao Van Diep, a teacher at Lomonosov My Dinh Primary School in Hanoi, it is extremely hard for teachers to remind students or manage them effectively in an online environment. Technical problems such as limited equipment, unstable internet connections, and reduced interaction between teachers and students also affect learning. Since many students are not familiar with online learning, they often lose concentration during lessons.

Another major concern is testing and evaluation. Teachers find it difficult to ensure that students complete tests honestly when **they** are learning remotely. Additionally, some schools have invested heavily in online teaching systems, but financial difficulties arise because they are not allowed to collect tuition fees during this period.
